





ENJOY THE STORY

Main Characters:

- Moses (3:1)
 - He notices the burning bush and checks it out.
- Messenger of the LORD (3:2)
 - Identified as the LORD (YHWH) and God (3:4).
 - YHWH does most of the speaking.
 - YHWH is the one who appeared to Moses and is the one with the plan.
- We assume Moses is the main character until YHWH appears on the scene.


ENJOY THE STORY

- **Story Obstacles** (new story tensions in this scene):
 - (1) Obstacle: Moses sees a burning bush (3:2).
 - Tension increases [Moses]: Why isn't the bush burning up?
 - (2) Obstacle: God calls to Moses from the bush (3:4).
 - Tension increases [Moses]: What does God want?



THEME, THEOLOGY & BIG IDEA

Theme (to original audience):

- > YHWH plans to send Moses to deliver his people
 - from the affliction and oppression of the Egyptians,
 - but Moses is reluctant
 - even with YHWH's presence and the confirming sign.

Theological Statement (for all audiences):

➤ God goes with us (Matthew 28:20) and will enable us to complete his calling (Matthew 28:18-19).

Big Idea (for our audience):

- Embrace God's call to teach (for Bible students).
- Trust God to be with you in Tanzania (for those going on a mission trip).



ENJOY THE STORY

Main Character:

> YHWH does most of the speaking.

Other Characters:

- Moses: makes an objection (3:13).
- Children of Israel: Moses is to inform them that YHWH sent him.
- Elders of Israel: Moses is to inform them of the plan deliver Israel from Egypt and take them to the land of Canaan.

ENJOY THE STORY

Plot Summary (obstacles + resolution):

- The people and elders will listen to
 - YHWH's words through Moses,
 - but Pharaoh will not,
 - so YHWH will send his strong hand,
 - and then Pharaoh will let them go,
 - and the people will plunder the Egyptians.



THEME, THEOLOGY & BIG IDEA

Theme (to original audience):

- > YHWH proves he is the "I am who I am"
 - by encouraging the children of Israel,
 - by recruiting the elders to confront Pharaoh,
 - by easily convincing Pharaoh via his strong hand
 - to let his people worship him in the wilderness,
 - and by giving the Israelites favor with the Egyptians,
 - so they exit with abundant silver, gold, and clothing.

THEME, THEOLOGY & BIG IDEA

Theological Statement (for all audiences):

- God easily carries out his impossible rescue plan
 - and richly blesses his people in the process.
 - Note: this is a general statement and not a promise.

Big Idea (for our audience):

- ➤ Rely on Jesus to completely cleanse you (for various audiences; connect with 1 John 1:9).
- ➤ Know that God can deliver you from financial chaos (for a money management workshop; include qualifiers that occur later in the story like in Exodus 5:6-19).
