In Egypt

- 1. Slavery & Infanticide
- 2. Moses flees to Midian.
- 3. The Burning Bush
- 4. Moses is reluctant.
- 5. Slavery gets worse.
- 6. God promises to deliver.
- 7. Aaron's staff becomes a serpent (#1) and water turns to blood (#2).
- 8. Frogs (#3) and insects (#4) invade Egypt.
- 9. Cattle die (#5), boils (#6) plague man and beast, and hail (#7) destroys Egypt.
- 10. Locusts (#8) devour Egypt and darkness (#9) blankets the land.
- 11. God announces the final plague—death of the firstborn (#10).
- 12. God prescribes the Passover Lamb and kills the firstborn of Egypt.

In the Wilderness

- 13. God leads the Israelites with a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night.
- 14. God parts the Red Sea to save his people and destroy the Egyptian army.
- 15. Moses crafts a memorial song.
- 16. God provides manna.
- 17. God provides water from the rock at Horeb.
- 18. Jethro counsels Moses.

At Mt. Sinai

- 19. Israel is to be a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.
- 20. God announces the Ten Commandments.
- 21. Laws: Hebrew slaves and personal injury.
- 22. Laws: property, worship, loans, widows and orphans, loans, and holiness.
- 23. Laws: courts, strangers, Sabbaths, and festivals. Description of the upcoming conquest.
- 24. The people affirm this covenant with God.
- 25. Tabernacle: financial offerings, the Ark, the Table of Showbread, and the Lampstand.
- 26. Tabernacle: curtains of linen and curtains of goat's hair, acacia wood, the blue veil.
- 27. Tabernacle: the bronze altar and the tabernacle court on the north and south sides.
- 28. Tabernacle: garments for the priests.
- 29. Tabernacle: consecration of the priests through sacrifices.
- 30. Tabernacle: alter of incense, payment for atonement, wash basin, anointing oil, and incense.
- 31. Tabernacle: skilled craftsmen, sign of the Sabbath.
- 32. Aaron fashions a golden calf and Moses intercedes for the people twice.
- 33. God announces he won't go with the Israelites and Moses intercedes again.
- 34. God proclaims his name and makes a covenant with Israel; Moses documents it.
- 35. Tabernacle: Sabbath, skilled craftsmen, financial offerings.
- 36. Tabernacle: financial offerings are more than enough and construction begins.
- 37. Tabernacle: construction continues, including on the Ark, the Table, and the Lampstand.
- 38. Tabernacle: construction is completed and its cost is documented.
- 39. Tabernacle: garments for the priest.
- 40. Tabernacle: it is setup on the first day of the second month and God's glory filled it.
