Lesson 2: Provision & Responsibility

Review: Created Equal

A. Genesis 1:24-31

- 1. God made humankind in his image as male and female (1:26a, 27).
- 2. God charged humankind with two tasks (1:26b, 28):
 - a. To populate the earth (i.e., be fruitful and multiply and fill).
 - b. To employ creatures of the sky, sea, and land for their benefit (i.e., subdue & rule).
- 3. After creating humankind, God declared his creation as "very good."

B. Application for Marriage

- 1. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are three distinct persons yet one God. (This is a mystery.)
 - a. Each is 100% God (John 1:1).
 - b. Each is 100% equal in all aspects (John 10:28-30).
 - c. Yet, each fulfills a different role.
 - (1) The Father sent the Son (John 3:16).
 - (2) The Son died for our sins as a sacrificial lamb (John 1:29).
 - (3) The Spirit lives in us (John 14:16-17).
- 2. Husband and wife are equal in all aspects, just like the three persons of the Trinity.
- 3. Husband and wife are designed to fill the earth and rule creation together.
 - a. A husband lacks the ability populate the earth apart from his wife.
 - b. God gave the charge to rule creation to both the man and woman (i.e., let them rule).
- 4. Challenge: Rule together as a team of equals.

Genesis 2:1-17 – Provision, Responsibility, and One Prohibition

A. Genesis 2:7-9 – Complete Provision

7	Then the LORD God formed the man of dust from the ground and breathed _{v1} into his nostrils the breath _{v2} of life _{n1} , and the man became a living _{a1} being.	
8	 And the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and there he put_{v1} the man whom he had formed. 	•

B. Genesis 2:15-17 – Responsibility & One Prohibition

15	The LORD God took the man	•
	and put _{v2} him in the garden of Eden	
	• to work it	
	 and keep it. 	
16	And the LORD God commanded the man,	•
	saying,	
	(a) "You may <mark>absolutely eat of every tree of the</mark>	
	garden,	
17	(b) but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil	
	you shall not eat ,	
	for in the day that you eat of it	
	you shall absolutely die."	

- 1. God gave Adam responsibility for working and keeping his (God's) garden.
- 2. God gave Adam freedom to eat from every tree in God's garden (except one).
- 3. God prohibited Adam from eating of the tree of knowledge.
- 4. Challenge: Look after all God gives you (especially your spouse).
