Read Luke 22:41-46

Father, **if** you are willing, Remove this cup from me. Yet, **not my will**, but yours be done.

An angel from heaven appeared to him **strengthening** him. And being in **agony**, he **prayed** more earnestly. And his sweat was like **drops of blood** falling to the ground.

Jesus learned: obedience (Heb. 5:8)

Jesus' Greater Purpose: eternal salvation to all who obey (Heb.5:9)
